What aspects of Policing in your Local area are important to you?

Specific to Causeway Coast and Glens the 5 most common answers were:-

1. Visible Policing - 49.1 %
2. ASB - 21.8 %
3. Drugs - 20.1 %
4. Road Traffic - 15.7 %
5. Domestic Abuse - 11.3 %

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How do you think the PSNI should improve Policing in your area?

Specific to Causeway Coast and Glens the 3 most common answers were:-

1. Visible Policing – 46.0 %
2. Prioritisation of Certain Crimes - 9.8 %
3. Targeted Policing * – 9.2 %
